One Good Turn

When I was 19, I was travelling alone in the Rocky Mountain States of the USA. In order to save money, I was carrying a small tent in my rucksack and I went hitch-hiking from campsite to campsite. When my tent was packed, it was no bigger than a loaf of bread and weighed only as much as a bag of flour. As a result, it was very convenient to carry but not particularly comfortable to sleep in.

It was rather early to sleep, but I had nothing else to do, so I closed my eyes and dozed off. I was woken up some time later by a loud siren - it was the grizzly bear alarm. I was terrified – my little tent provided no protection against a bear, but I had nowhere else to go. All I could do was stay silent and hope it would not notice me.

Fortunately, one of my neighbours in one of the large camper vans nearby realised the danger I was in. He came over to my tent and invited me to join him and his family in their van. I was a little bit wary about accompanying a complete stranger
